1. Tram and Bus

- **Tram System:**

1. Nice has an extensive tram network with 3 main lines:
 1. **Line 1:** Connects the northern suburbs to the city center (e.g., Gare Thiers to Pasteur).
 2. **Line 2:** Links Nice Airport to the Port and city center.
 3. **Line 3:** Serves the airport and western suburbs.
2. Tickets: A single trip costs €1.50. Purchase tickets at vending machines located at tram stops or via the Lignes d'Azur mobile app.

- **Bus System:**

1. The Lignes d'Azur bus network covers the city and surrounding areas, including destinations like Monaco and Antibes.
2. Important routes:
 1. **Bus 100:** Nice to Monaco (€1.50).
 2. **Bus 200:** Nice to Cannes (€1.50).
3. Tickets must be validated upon boarding.

- **Safety and Fines:**

1. Always validate your ticket in the machine to avoid fines (€50-€150 if caught without a valid ticket).

3. Train

- **Regional Trains (TER):**

 - **Toll Roads:** Many highways in the region are toll roads. Keep coins or a credit card handy.
