Transportation

Metro System: Paris has an extensive metro system. Familiarize yourself with the metro map and consider buying a multi-day pass. Walking: Paris is very walkable, especially in areas like the Marais, Latin Quarter, and along the Seine. Buses and Trams: Useful for areas not well-covered by the metro. Bus routes often provide a scenic view of the city. Taxis and Ride-Sharing: Use apps like G7, Uber, or

Bolt for convenience.

There are approximately 16,000 restaurants in Paris. Here is the secret  restaurants do no want you to know.

- 25% are **terrible** so let's forget the bottom 4,000 restaurants
- Next 25% are **mediocre** so let's forget the mediocre 4,000 restaurants
